Mr Robert Ong was invited as one of the Adjudicators for the event.

Immediately following the Tokyo Open, the 9th SGDF Singapore Nationals DanceSport Championships were held a week later. The Chairman of Adjudicators was Ms Natasa Ambroz (Slovenia). Overseas adjudicators at this event included Nick Fok (Hong Kong), George Tan (Malaysia) and Sylvia Loo (Malaysia). The event was held at the Hougang Community Club, and this was the second time that the Nationals were held at this venue

Ms Natasa Ambroz also conducted several workshops for our members the next day after the event. This was very well attended by members who came away with valuable knowledge and lessons on basic dance techniques, and ways to better improve their dancing.

JULY 2009



Singapore was specially invited to participate in an Invitational Event at the Final Malaysia National Ranking Championships, held in Batu Pahat. A team of 10 athletes (Latin Grade C) and 2 athletes (Latin Junior), accompanied by parents and supporters were present at the Championship. Supporting this event were Ms May Ng, the emcee for the event; Mr Michael Lim & Ms Hwa Mee Thoo, the official scrutineers; and Mr Robert Ong & Ms Sabrina Sim, the overseas adjudicators.

The team came away victorious, returning home with a medal haul of 1 Gold, 2 Silvers and 1 Bronze Medal. Our Latin Grade C athletes did Singapore proud by finishing in 1st to 5th placing, and 2nd in the Latin Junior event. For many in the Latin Grade C event, this was their first Grade C event, and first overseas championship.
