11th SGDF SINGAPORE NATIONALS

The 11th SGDF Singapore National DanceSport Championships kicked off the new financial year (FY10) with a bang – at a new venue and with new challenges! The beautifully-renovated indoor sports hall at Raffles Institution provided an environment that was perfect for such an event. SGDF had the honour to test out the venue, which was freshly renovated in time for the coming 2010 Youth Olympic Games (YOG).

The event itself was also challenging for both competitors and organisers. For the first time, the SGDF invited guest competitors, from neighbouring country federations, to compete in selected events. This is to provide a new impetus for improvement for our local athletes and at the same time, offer loyal supporters the opportunity to view new faces with different styles of dancing from the region.

Something new for our local athletes to look forward to was the revised ranking points for National Championships with foreign participation. The SGDF Executive Committee recognised that with foreign participation at the Nationals, the competitive bar to do well was raised and hence, as a further motivation to our athletes, the ranking points were doubled. This new system was very well received by our athletes.



The Championships started promptly and the spectators clearly enjoyed the competition. The inclusion of the team from Malaysia was indeed a welcome change. The Guest-of-Honour was Mr Tan Nam Seng, Deputy Principal (Planning & Resources) (left).

During the dinner break, a short video on the projects, initiatives and events that the SGDF has organised in the past eight years was screened. It brought back memories for many who were present in the audience, and it became a talking point over dinner.

We look forward to your support at the 12th SGDF Singapore National DanceSport Championships at the end of the year.


SGDF INVITED TO MALAYSIA

Following the idea that started in 2009, Singapore athletes were invited to Malaysia to participate in the Malaysia Professional DanceSport Council (MPDC) National Ranking Championships. The idea was first discussed between SGDF President Mr Robert Ong and MPDC President Mr George Tan, that both countries could start inviting each other to help raise the standards of competition, and to foster closer friendship between officials, coaches and athletes. The team from Singapore was led by Ms Tiara Zhang and Mr Rick Peh, both seasoned competitors. The SGDF chartered a bus which took the competitors to Kuala Lumpur for the Championship, which was held on 18 April 2010. SGDF members can look forward to more 'dancesport' exchanges in the future.



OUR FIRST CHAMPIONSHIPS

SGDF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 19th SGDF Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on Sunday, 20 July 2010, at 3:30pm at the Grand Mercure Roxy (Singapore). The AGM covered several important issues, including the new directive from the Singapore Sports Council (SSC) that all National Sports Associations (NSAs) are required to register as a Charity by 31 December 2010. Of the 64 NSAs, only a handful were registered as a Charity.

Before the AGM, a short video of the SGDF was also screened.



TORONTO, CANADA



The 2010 IDSF World Youth Ten Dance Championships were held from 16-18 April 2010 in Toronto, Canada. Ms Sabrina Sim was nominated by an independent selection panel from IDSF, to be on the Panel of Adjudicators for this event. In addition, there was the 2010 Crystal Leaf International Competition which included the IDSF International Open Standard & Latin events, as well as the Open Youth Latin and Standard events.

Representing Singapore at both the IDSF Open Latin & Open Youth Latin events was Singapore's top Youth and Adult pair of Lim Chong Aik & Riane Low.

The outbound flight from Singapore's Changi Airport to Toronto's Pearson International Airport clocked a total of 14 hours, while the return journey took the team a total of 18 hours (including a 6 hour transit in Dubai). The Official Hotel was the Doubletree by Hilton, which was a convenient 5 minutes away from the airport. It was, however, a good thirty minutes away from downtown Toronto. The event organiser, Mr Oleg Yedlin made sure that both competitors, adjudicators and guests were well taken care of, and everything from the check-in ran smoothly.

A total of 29 pairs of young athletes took part in the World Youth Ten Dance event. The raw power and talent that oozed out from the 29 pairs of youth athletes was simply amazing, and you can be sure that the adjudicators had a difficult time selecting the athletes for the next and subsequent rounds. When you think you've seen it all, the Finals itself proved to be a different ballgame – every single finalist upped the ante with even more power, speed, accuracy in timing and fluency in movement. It was amazing!

The next day, both Lim Chong Aik & Riane Low did Singapore proud in the Youth Open Latin when they finished in 18th Position; ahead of participants from the previous day (World Championships) from France, Finland, Japan, Canada, Serbia, Latvia, Denmark and Ukraine.
